WORKSHOP 1 (only on Thursday)

(International) Interprofessional Education – Get inspired!

INPRO hosts: Ingrid Aerts (Belgium, AP) & Ursula Hemetek (Austria, St. Poelten)

International interprofessional education (IPE) is a powerful approach to education and collaboration of learners, that brings together students and professionals from various health and social care professions to learn with, from, and about each other. It fosters teamwork, communication, and a holistic understanding of patient-centered care. To get inspired by international interprofessional education, you will have the opportunity to experience didactical approaches to interprofessional education in this interactive workshop. Tools and techniques applied in the INPRO project will be introduced and discussed with the audience.

WORKSHOP 2 (both days)

Get ready for an Interprofessional Learning Ward in Education and Practice!

In INPRO various materials are developed and tested to set-up a Student-Run Interprofessional Learning Ward (SR-IPLW). The learnings of various perspectives (students, professionals, patients, lecturers and managers) working and learning at a SR-IPLW have been described and will be discussed in this workshop. Moreover, we will inspire and challenge you to implement a SR-IPLW in your own setting. As a result you will leave the workshop with your first steps setting up a SR-IPLW!







WORKSHOP 3 (both days) The Interprofessional journey starts with a dream

Interprofessionalism is gaining more and more attention in education and workfield. It is a term that is used a lot, but how can we bring it in reality? A main challenge is to embed interprofessional education/collaboration in day-to-day practice. It is described in the ideal setting with interprofessional attitude, interprofessional skills, where many professions are represented, and professionals collaborate in a combination of practice, education, and research. We are convinced that interprofessionalism is a must in health and well-being but how can we make it more concrete? What are the goals? What do we want to achieve? What are the barriers and facilitators? In this workshop we are going with you on this interprofessional journey by sharing our project in Netherlands. We will also let you develop your dreams for interprofessionalism.

WORKSHOP 4 (both days)

Thoughts on interprofessional supervision practice

INPRO hosts: Jaana Ritsilä (Finland, JAMK) & Katrien Colman (The Netherlands, Hanze University of Applied Sciences)

Traditionally, a trainee within rehabilitation care is supervised by a supervisor from their own profession. Interprofessional supervision (IPS) occurs between a supervisor and a supervisee who do not share the same profession and is as such a break from that tradition. Breaking with tradition means changing practice. After all, isn't the only constant in life change? In this workshop, we will actively engage in imagining the opportunities that interprofessional supervision offers us for learning as professionals and students. Drawing from (y)our own interprofessional collaboration practice, we will explore the features that might underpin your IPS practice. At the end of the workshop, you will be able to immediately apply what you have learned in the workshop on interprofessional supervision. You will identify factors that support you to keep the learned skills to be permanent part of your work. These factors will be reflected to the Kirkpatrick's Model for learning.

WORKSHOP 5 (both days)

The use of ICF in goal-setting in interprofessional teams

INPRO hosts: Anu Myllyharju-Puikkonen (Finland, JAMK), Jos Vloet (The Netherlands, Hanze University of Applied Sciences), Ellen Van Lingen (The Netherlands, Rehabilitation Friesland)

The International Classification of Functioning, Disability, and Health (ICF) is a framework developed by the World Health Organization (WHO) that provides a standardized language and system for describing health and health-related states. Interprofessional health workers, comprising professionals from various healthcare disciplines, play a pivotal role in utilizing the ICF. Interprofessional teams can use the ICF to collaboratively assess patients' functioning, set goals, and develop individualized care plans that address their specific needs. It helps in identifying the multifaceted factors influencing







an individual's health, encompassing not only physical aspects but also social, psychological, and environmental factors. Moreover, the ICF promotes effective communication among healthcare professionals, enabling them to better understand each other's perspectives and contributions to client's care. This interdisciplinary approach enhances the quality of care and outcomes for patients with complex health conditions. In this workshop you will practice the use of ICF in goal-setting in interprofessional teams by discussing a case.
