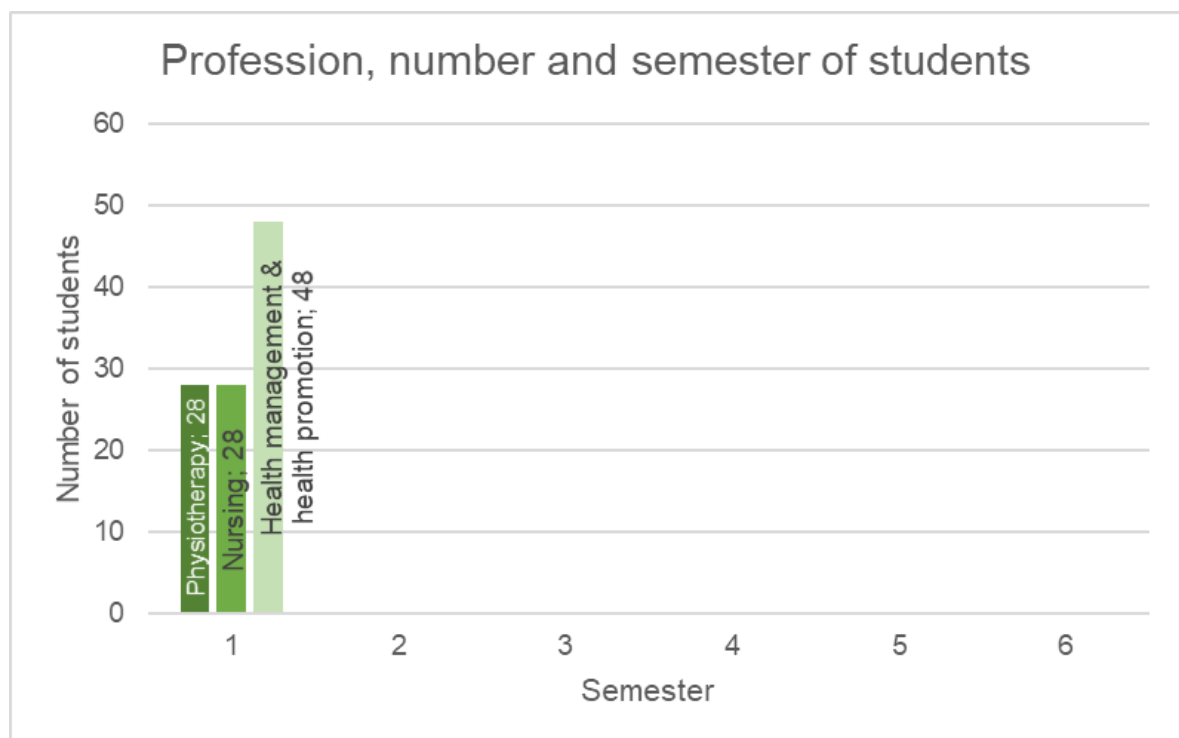
Description

In order to show students, the high importance of interdisciplinary cooperation in the health care system from the very beginning, the course "The Austrian Health Care System" is already held in the 1st semester of the Bachelor's degree programs "Health Management and Health Promotion", "Physiotherapy" and "Health and Nursing". This is a lecture with approx. 100 students. By working on case studies, it is possible to convey the different perspectives on a health problem to the students, whereby an active exchange between the study courses is encouraged. When working on the different teaching contents, answers to the following questions are worked out together with the students: What is the role of the respective professional group in the respective field of work (e.g., health promotion and prevention)? What are the different perspectives of the individual professions (e.g., understanding of health)? How can interdisciplinary cooperation contribute to meeting individual challenges in health care?
