Person-centred, interprofessional learning

	Content	The purpose of the “specialist hour” is for rehabilitation professionals to get to know each other. Each “specialist hour” includes a presentation by three professionals, in which they talk about their work in general and at Coronaria, and present a client case where they have implemented the use of ICF framework. Finally, a discussion together on interprofessional cooperation.

Findings from the evaluation:

Reaction	These kind of “specialist hour” sessions were welcome since there was a wish for this theme from a questionnaire sent to all rehabilitation professionals at Coronaria in January 2022.
Learning	These “specialist hours” could be further developed, especially in regard to an interprofessional discussion together with the client.
Results	The “specialist hours” are regularly implemented at Coronaria.

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
